SUNDAY (dinner)

6pm – Meet at the bar of our motel for pre-dinner drinks & nibbles before dinner.

Accommodation: Explorers Motel, Roma x 2 nights

MONDAY (continental breakfast, lunch & dinner)

This morning we'll travel to **Mount Hope property** and meet the Price family to hear how they have embraced coal seam gas and work closely with Santos on their property.

Return to Roma after lunch via Mount Saltbush Road, and an interesting look at the gas industry. You will have some free time back in Roma to do your own exploring -

7pm – meet for dinner in motel.

TUESDAY (continental breakfast, lunch & dinner)

Arrive at the **Roma Saleyards** for a tour of the largest cattle selling centre in Australia, with over 400,000 cattle passing through each year. Enjoy some time in the new state-of-the-art interpretive centre telling the story of the cattle industry. As you enter the Interpretive Centre, you could be forgiven for thinking you'd joined a cattle drive on the long paddock.

We'll have a cuppa in the café before heading to the small rural town of **Surat** for lunch.

Continuing along the Carnarvon Highway, we will arrive in St. George this afternoon.

Dinner in River's Restaurant at the motel.

WEDNESDAY (continental breakfast, lunch & dinner)

8.30am Join your Cotton & Winery Tour at the front of the motel. Enjoy the onboard commentary provided by a local cotton farmer as they showcase their fully operational cotton farm and learn how cotton is grown, irrigated, and harvested. Once finished you will head onto Riversands Wines for a vineyard tour before being treated to a personalised wine tasting and a delicious lunch with entertainment in their relaxed country garden.

Following your tour, you'll have free time until we meet for dinner at 6.30pm. A suggestion is to visit "The Unique Egg", where Steve Margaritis has been hand carving emu eggs for more than 60 years, pop into the Visitor Centre and take a walk along part of the Balonne River or perhaps enjoy a sunset river cruise.

THURSDAY (continental breakfast, lunch & dinner)

Departing St. George, we'll travel west to Cunnamulla via Bollon, where we will have morning tea. Continue onto Cunnamulla for lunch and then some free time to look around, spend time at the Cunnamulla Visitor Centre & get your pic with the Cunnamulla Fella, check out the Artesian Time Tunnel, Museum & latest Art Gallery display or take a dip in the new Cunnamulla Hot Springs.

4pm – head to Cunnamulla Railway Station for the **Cunnamulla "All Aboard" 3D Sound & Light Spectacular!** Sit back and relax in the modern theatre as the holographic host, Station Master (Steven Tandy), whisks you back in time on a memorable journey to the "end of the line".

Return to your accommodation for dinner in the restaurant.

Accommodation: Club Boutique Hotel, Cunnamulla x 1 night

FRIDAY (continental breakfast, lunch & dinner)

First up, we meet with the Mayor in the council chambers and then head west to the little town of **Eulo** before we drive through to **Alroy Station**, a working sheep & cattle station for lunch and a chat with Mac & Mary.

Our final stop today will be at **Toogunna Plains Farmstay**, a 5th generation sheep and cattle property near the town of Eromanga. The town is most noted for being the furthest town from the sea and home to **The Eromanga Natural History Museum**.

Enjoy welcome sunset drinks and canapés over the red sandhills. Just spectacular!

Accommodation: Toogunna Plains Farmstay x 2 nights

SATURDAY (cooked breakfast, lunch & dinner)

Following a delicious breakfast, we'll head out with our hosts for a tour of just part of the expansive 130,000 acre "**Belombre**" property.

This afternoon head in through town to **The Eromanga Natural History Museum**, which is committed to discovering, conserving, and showcasing the fossil, natural and cultural heritage of the upper Murray/Darling and Lake Eyre/Cooper basins.

Whilst here we'll do the Australian Dinosaur Giants Tour. Titanosaurs are one of the last remaining sauropod groups in the Cretaceous Period and were the largest ever land-dwelling animals. See the bones of *Australotitan cooperensis*, or more commonly known as Cooper, the largest bones of any animal to have walked the Australian continent. The expert guides have an in-depth knowledge of fossil hunting and delight in unravelling the mysteries of the past. They'll demonstrate exposing the fossilised bone using specialised tools. You'll also see the incredible Eulo megafauna fossils and other natural history collections. It's not every day that you get close enough to touch a 95-million-year-old dinosaur bone!

Enjoy dinner this evening and time relaxing with fellow travellers around the campfire before retiring to your comfortable bed.

SUNDAY (cooked breakfast, lunch & dinner)

After breakfast we will head north through **Kyabra Station**, continuing past **Thylungra Station**, which was Australia's largest sheep station in its heyday in the 1950's, both stations being part of the Durack's story. Thylungra was initially established as a cattle station by pioneer Patrick Durack in 1868. Arriving at **Trinidad Station**, we'll meet up with owner Wendy for a great chat and smoko. Our journey today continues north via Yaraka where we'll have lunch at the **Yaraka Pub** before travelling through **Emmett** to Blackall where we will check into our accommodation.

Accommodation: Oasis Motor Inn, Blackall x 2 night

Dinner in the motel restaurant, The Woolshed Baa & Grill.

MONDAY (breakfast, lunch & dinner)

After breakfast we head out to the **Blackall Woolscour** for an hour-long tour, with one of the friendly local tour guides and wander back in time through the historical Woolscour to share the yarns and tales about the great Aussie Battlers who built the backbone of the Australian Wool Industry. Marvel at the bush ingenuity and engineering excellence, are some of the only kinds still operating in the world. See, smell, and touch the historic machinery and lanolin-soaked exhibits of a bygone era and gain a deeper understanding and pride in where our nation has come from.

Onwards for a short inspection and chat at the **Blackall Saleyards** before heading to **Shannendoah Park** for a chat and lunch with Shirley. This afternoon includes a visit to Red Ridge Interior, for a look at some authentic Indigenous designs. Perhaps take a stroll from town to the Barcoo River, where there's a nature walk that will lead you to a bird hide.

5pm – meet up for transfer to the Blackall Woolscour and our farewell dinner. Enjoy sunset drinks & nibbles followed by an exclusive 3-course dinner in the woolshed.

Enjoy breakfast before it's time to say farewell and wish you safe travels.
